About the Town

Tiptur is a town in the southern part of the state of Karnataka, India. It is the second largest and the fastest growing town in Tumkur district. It is a sub divisional headquarters of Tumkur district in Karnataka. The town is known for its coconut plantations. The copra town has features of Arid Region. The town was founded in 11th century A.D. by the Ganga/Nolamba dynasties. The town has a population of around 60 thousand (as per 2011 census) and Kannada is the official language. Tiptur is said to have got its name from 'Tipatala', the word for 'copra' in the local language. Tiptur has an average elevation of 861 metres (2825 ft). The average temperature in summer is 34° C and in winter is 20° C. Tiptur is approximately 73 km west of Tumkur along National highway 206. It is at a distance of 140 km northwest from the state capital Bangalore. It lies on the Bangalore-Miraj railway line.

Tiptur has an Agricultural Produce Market committee (APMC) market. Farmers from nearby taluks and villages carry their coconut produce to the market for auction. Traders from Tiptur supply coconut throughout the world. There are also silk firms that weave silk sarees. A few garments industries are established to provide employment for the people of the taluk. The major occupation is farming, cattle rearing, goat and sheep rearing. Small scale industries related to Coconut products like coir products, desiccated coconut powder are also found here.

The nearby tourist places are Kalleshwara temple depicting Hoysala art in Aralaguppe village, Madalingana Kanive and Boranakanive Dam in Chikkanayakanahalli, Chowdeshwari Temple in Dasarighatta, Keragodi – Rangapura Mutt, Mallagatta Tank, GKVK campus and Akshaya kalpa Farm. Tiptur is well connected by road routes. Both KSRTC and Private bus service is available connecting with major cities of the state including Bangalore, Shivamogga, Hassan, Chikkamagalur, Tumkur, Davanagere, Bellari and Chitradurga. Tiptur has its own two railway station in its limits (Tiptur, Sri Sharadha Nagar) with connections to Bangalore, Shivamogga, Chikkamagalur, Hubli and other places. Some notable people from the city are Narasimharaju – Renowned Kannada comedy actor and Raja Ramanna – Nuclear scientist, who supervised Pokhran Nuclear tests of 1974.

About the College:

Government First Grade College, Tiptur

There are many Government, Aided and Private educational institutions in Tiptur that offer Pre-University courses, Undergraduate courses, Master's Degrees and Technical courses. Government First Grade College, Tiptur is established in 2007 & offers courses in Arts, Commerce, Science, Management and Computer Applications (BA, BCom, BBM, BSc, BCA). It has been permanently affiliated with the Government of Karnataka and Tumakuru University. It has attained 2(f) and 12(B) status from UGC.
